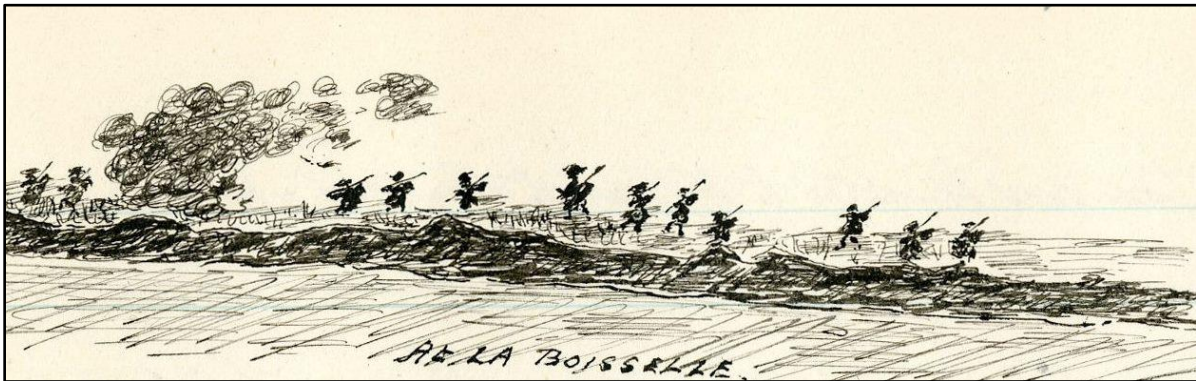

About the Cemetery Codes used in Part 4

The author researched and wrote this book in the 1990s. It was designed to be published in print although, sadly, this was not achieved during his lifetime.

Throughout the text, John Bilcliffe used a set of alpha-numeric codes to abbreviate cemetery names.

In Part 4 each soldier's name is followed by a Cemetery Code and, where known, the Grave Reference, as identified by the Commonwealth War Graves Commission. Here are two examples of the codes and what they represent:

There is something rather insidious about compiling statistics of casualties. A man killed in action or dying from his wounds is much more than just another number in a table. But in trying to appreciate what happened in the Somme battles, so as to give an accurate overview, tables are probably inevitable.

The figures may not include all soldiers who were wounded and subsequently died of their wounds at home, though every effort has been made to identify them. There is no general information regarding the date when soldiers who were wounded subsequently died of their wounds. We have only the date of their death. Regrettably it may not, therefore, have been possible to record those soldiers in the Somme roll of honour.

In respect of others, the rule has been adopted that any soldier who died of wounds on or after the start of a battle is assumed to have been wounded in that battle and not in the previous action. There is obviously a risk of error. Soldiers who died of wounds on 1 July are assumed to have been wounded on that date. Soldiers who died of wounds in December, unless at home, have not been included in the battalion figures for the Somme. Soldiers who died of disease while recuperating, or by accident, if identified, are included in the overall total and in the battalion total, if the date of death was between 1 July and 31 December 1916.

Of the total DLI casualties of the Somme campaign, 121 were Officers and 2348 were Other Ranks. Officers represented 4.9% of the 2469 Somme total and 0.9% of the War total.

From the above table it can be seen that the 15th Battalion suffered more than any other DLI battalion, both in terms of the Somme in 1916 and the Great War as a whole. This battalion lost 139 all ranks killed on the first day of the Somme Offensive (1 July 1916) and another 138 in the Battle of Flers-Courcelette (135 on 16 September 1916). September was in fact the most serious month for losses in the Regiment (984 killed in action or died of wounds) and during that month the Battle of Flers-Courcelette accounted for 784 of the casualties. The other main disaster day was 5 November 1916, when the attack on the Butte de Warlencourt claimed 281 lives. Many, wounded, died later.

This list may not be complete as Officers not noted may have died in the United Kingdom from wounds received on the Somme. There is no definitive list of these deaths but the Commonwealth War Graves Commission's listing is the most comprehensive and is amended when necessary. Officers who died at home include Lieutenant Colonel Fitzgerald (15 DLI) and Second Lieutenant Moon-Ord (7 DLI).

2nd Battalion DLI

The 2nd Battalion DLI was part of the 18th Brigade (as was the 14th Battalion), 6th Division, XIV Corps. The 6th Division was credited with the following Battles and Actions:

Battle of Flers-Courcelette	15-22 September
Battle of Morval	25-28 September
Capture of Lesboeufs	25 September
Battle of Le Transloy	1-18 October

BATTALION ITINERARY 1916

2 August: Arrived at Doullens from Ypres area and then to Amplier.
4 August: To Acheux.
6 August: Moved forward with two companies in front line (Gordon Trench), one in support at Hamel, one in reserve at Mensil.
12 August: Relieved and moved to Beaussart.
14 August: To Mailly-Maillet Wood. Digging trenches south from Roberts Trench.
20 August: Relieved 11th Essex Regiment in front line.
26 August: Relieved by 1/6th Cheshire Regiment and to camp, just north of Acheux
27-29 August: To Amplier, Longuevillette and Vignacourt.
6-7 September: To Coisy and Sailly-le-Sac.
11-12 September: To Sand Pit Camp and Citadel Camp.
14 September: Moved forward to valley just south of Montauban.
15 September: Assembled at The Triangle and at 7.30 pm bombed down Straight Trench towards the Quadrilateral.
16 September: Renewed attack. Relieved by 1st West Yorkshire Regiment and withdrew to Trones Wood.
18 September: In reserve at Guillemont-Wedgwood Trench during attack on the Quadrilateral.
19 September: Relieved and went to Meaulte.
21 September: To Trones Wood and took over trenches north-east of Ginchy.
24 September: To Trones Wood.
25 September: Attacked and took sunken road west of Lesboeufs.
29 September: Relieved and went to Meaulte.
30 September: To Mericourt L'Abbe.
7 October: To Citadel Camp.
8 October: Moved forward via Trones Wood to trenches near Gueudecourt.
9 October: Withdrew to reserve bivouacs near Trones Wood.

7 October: Attack on Le Sars. 12 DLI to attack The Tangle and the sunken Eaucourt l'Abbaye road east of Le Sars with a tank in support.

8 October: Relieved and rested at Becourt Wood.

15 October: Entrained for the Ypres sector

24 June: Picquengy north-west of Amiens.

3 July: In reserve in trenches along the railway embankment south of Albert.

4 July: All four battalions of 68th Brigade to Becourt Wood. Because of congestion, 13 DLI returned to Albert.

6 July: Returned to Becourt Wood and remained in reserve.

7 July: Took over Brigade Line trenches.

8 July: Occupied line from Birch Tree Avenue, near Peake Wood. Patrols pushed forward to Bailiff Wood, Quadrangle Trench and Contalmaison.

9 July: Patrols to Bailiff Wood.

10 July: Two platoons of 'A' Company in support of 69 Brigade. Another party from 13 DLI helped a battalion of Yorkshire Light Infantry to consolidate.

11 July: Relieved by the 1st Cameron Highlanders. Marched back to Albert.

15 July: Moved to the reserve lines.

16 July: Took over trenches from 6th Bedfordshire Regiment near Contalmaison Wood. Digging party assisted 12 DLI and was shelled.

17/18 July: Took over trenches from 12 DLI astride Contalmaison to Pozieres road.

19 July: Relieved in evening and 13 DLI withdrew to Albert through barrage of gas shells.

20 July: To Franvillers for a week's rest.

26 July: In support trenches in Contalmaison.

27 July: Took over front line in the evening in the German trench system south-east from behind Pozieres known as OG1 and OG2.

28 July: Digging of Butterworth Trench and bombing of Munster Alley. Relieved that night.

29-31 July: At Albert.

1 August: To Peake Wood.

2 August: To front line. Sap dug from Butterworth Trench and bombing post strengthened in Munster Alley.

3 August: In evening withdrew to dug-outs near Contalmaison.

4 August: Moved up again ready for attack on Torr Trench and its junction with Munster Alley. Three attempts were made with much loss.

5 August: Relieved during evening and moved back to Albert.

11 August: By train from the Somme to Armentieres.

10 September: returned to Somme. By train arrived at Longuea, marched to Molliens-au-Bois and then to Millencourt arriving on 14 September.



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15-16 September: Reached Becourt Wood and to trenches near Bazentin-le- Grand. Provided working parties for 140 and 141 Brigades form 47th Division.
 17 September: Party taking bombs to 6th Londoners heavily shelled.
 19 September: 'B' Company assisted 140 Brigade in regaining the junction of the Flers line and Drop Alley Trench, one mile north-east of High Wood.
 20 September: 'B' Company rejoined battalion at Becourt Wood.
 22 September: To support trenches near Martinpuich.
 23 September: Lieutenant Colonel Lindsay wounded and leaves battalion.
 24 September: 'D' Company relieved company of 11th Northumberland Fusiliers in northern outskirts of Martinpuich.
 26 September: Whole battalion in line but by evening were relieved and withdrew to Becourt Wood.
 3 October: Relieved 8 DLI in support trenches before Le Sars.
 6 October: Began to take over the front from the 11th Northumberland Fusiliers.
 7 October: Attack on Le Sars. 13 DLI to clear part of the village and establish a line beyond.

BATTALION ITINERARY 1916

13 June: At Buire on the river Ancre.

18 June: Prepared for move to assembly trenches. The Divisional plan was to advance after the Germans were overrun and the sunken road reached, to pass through and take Crucifix Trench, Shelter Wood and the Quadrangle.

30 June: To assembly trenches.

1 July: In assault. By 8.30 had taken Crucifix Trench. At 13.40 advanced to Shelter Wood. In evening relieved but this was not completed until dawn.

2 July: At 6 am, 15 DLI assembled in the original British front line.

3 July: Carried up water, ammunition and bombs to 62nd Brigade in Shelter Wood.

9 July: After a few day's rest, moved forward to complete the work "so brilliantly done".

11 July: 21st Division took over the line.

13 July: Arrived at Lonely Copse, north of Fricourt.

15 July: Moved up to behind Mametz Wood in support, but returned.

16 July: In afternoon ordered to take over part of the front in Bazentin-le-Petit Wood. Reached north-east corner of Mametz Wood at dusk.

17 July: By 0600 held west and north-west portions of Mametz Wood with the 10 King's Own Yorkshire Light Infantry on the right.

18 July: Relieved and bivouacked between Meaulte and Becordal-Becourt.

20 July: Moved away from the Somme to Arras sector.

1-10 September: At Izel-les-Hameaux in training for the return to the Somme.

10 September: By train to Frevent.

13 September: From Frevent to Mericourt and marched to Dernancourt.

15 September: Arrived at the Pommiers Redoubt. Came under the orders of 41st. Division. 64th Brigade to be used for fresh attack on Gird trench system west of Gueudecourt.

16 September: At 2 am started for line. Arrived 5.30 in shell holes just behind Flers Trench. At 9.15, shrapnel barrage began and 15 DLI advanced. 15 DLI got within 70 yards of the German trench, but at dusk withdrew to Flea Trench.

17 September: At dawn retired to the sunken part of the Ginchy road and then to a position south of Flers, but still under heavy shell fire. In the evening withdrawn to Pommiers Redoubt.

18 September: Moved to tents at Becordel-Becourt. Rested until 22 September

23 September: 64th Brigade relieved the 62nd Brigade at front with 15 DLI on the left.

24 September: 15 DLI gave way to troops of the 110th Brigade and went into the reserve line.

25 September: In reserve during the attack. Came up via Gap trench

26 September: At 7.15 am attack supported by a tank and aircraft. Gird Trench reached and passed and by afternoon were east of Gueudecourt. In evening, 15 DLI relieved and spent the night back on the Gueudecourt/Lesboeufs road.

29 September: Back at Pommiers Redoubt.



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30 September: Left Pommiers by bus to Ribemont and after a few days arrived in the Bethune sector on 11 October.

18th Battalion DLI

The 18th (Durham Pals) Battalion DLI was part of the 93rd Brigade, 31st Division, firstly with VIII Corps and then XIII Corps. The 31st Division was credited with the following Battles:

Battle of Albert,	1-13 July - VIII Corps
Battle of The Ancre,	13-18 November - XIII Corps

BATTALION ITINERARY 1916

4 June: Arrived at Courcelles and then engaged in digging assembly trenches, making dug-outs etc in preparation for the great offensive.

20 June: On the left of the line opposite the German trenches in front of the ruins of Serre. 'D' Company was to form part of the assaulting troops and was having a week's special training, attached to 16th West Yorkshire Regiment.

30 June: 'D' Company moved up to their assembly position with 15 and 16 West Yorkshire Regiment. At 22.15 the remainder of 18 DLI left Courcelles, moved north of Colincamps, and reached Maitland assembly trench at 4.50 am on 1 July.

1 July: 'D' Company joined initial assault, with the planned advance to go south of Serre and then swing to north-east. At 9.30, the remaining three companies were ordered forward to Monk Trench. At noon, 18 DLI held Monk, Flag and Maitland trenches. In the afternoon and evening reorganisation went on under German fire. 18 DLI took over the front line before nightfall.

2 July: Holding front line; wiring the front posts and collected wounded. Buried the dead.

4 July: Battalion faced high explosive and tear shells.

5 July: By 5 am, 18 DLI had been relieved and assembled at Louvencourt.

7 July: 18 DLI left Louvencourt for Bemeuil for a day's rest and then moved to La Perriere and the Bethune sector.

21 October: To Sailly-au-Bois, relieving the 12th East Yorkshires in support to the Hebuterne sector.

23 October: 'A' and 'B' Companies shelled out of their billets.

26 October: Relieved 18th West Yorkshires in Hebuterne south sector. At 'Suicide Corner'.

30 October: Relieved by 12th York and Lancashire Regiment. To Rossignol Farm.

7 November: Returned to Hebuterne south sector, relieving 14th York and Lancashire Regiment

11 November: Handed over to 18 West Yorkshires.

13-14 November: Battle of the Ancre. HQ, 'A', 'B' Companies west of Courcelles; 'C', 'D' Companies returned to Rossignol Farm.

17 November: Inter-company relief.

19 November: All companies met up at Sailly and took over Hebuterne north sector from 18th West Yorkshires.

Battle of Delville Wood	15 July-3 September (when 19 DLI was under command of 9th Division)

BATTALION ITINERARY 1916

2 July: By train south from Chocques to Frevent. Then marched via Le Souich, Bois de Warnimont and Bresle to Bois des Tailles, west of Bray-sur-Somme.

15 July: Reached trenches behind Montauban. Under shell fire which caused some casualties. Came under orders of 9th Division that was engaged in struggle for Longueval and Delville Wood.

8 July: Assisted 26th Brigade (9th Division) in fresh attack on Delville Wood. Moved forward about 7.15 pm. Arrived at Longueval in late evening.

9 July: Attack cancelled. 19 DLI spent all day assisting in consolidating gains under German shell fire.

20 July: Relieved and bivouacked at Caftet Wood near Carnoy.

21-23 July. 19 DLI sent 300 men to dig a communication trench forward from Trones Wood to Waterlot Farm.

24-25 July: All 19 DLI moved up to spend two days digging reserve trenches on the slopes south-west of Longueval.

26 July: Returned to Caftet Wood and later to Silesia Trench in the old German front line south of Montauban.

29 July: All 106th Brigade as reserve to the 89th Brigade (30th Division) that was to attack next day, from Malzhorn to Guillemont.

30 July: 19 DLI got as far as a sunken road south of Bernafay Wood. At night marched back to Caftet Wood.

31 July: Returned to Sand Pit Valley near Meaulte.

1-19 August: At Morlancourt and Foudrinoy.

20 August: Moved up to Sand Pit Valley.

22 August: In the trenches on the slope of Malzhorn Ridge north of Hardecourt. Incessant shelling caused many casualties. 35th Division's front ran from Hardecourt to the Trones Wood/Guillemont road.

24 August: Planned attack cancelled. Patrol work under fire from German snipers. That night 35th Division started to hand over to the 5th Division. Retired to Happy Valley.

29 August: 19 DLI left the Somme and arrived in the Arras sector on 3 September.

BATTALION ITINERARY 1916

24 August-6 September: At Yaucourt Bussus in training for the Somme.

6 September: Moved south to the Somme front and the forward area near Pommiers Redoubt, Carlton and Savoy Trenches.

10 September: 20 DLI relieved 7th Liverpool Regiment in support trenches west of Longueval.

11 September: 'C' Company moved through 11th West Surrey Regiment and dug a chain of posts in no-man's-land.

12 September: 20 DLI relieved West Surreys; posts linked and communication trenches dug.

13 September: 20 DLI relieved and moved back at Pommiers Redoubt early on 14 September.

14 September: Moved up to Check Line behind the crest of a ridge on which were the villages of Bazentin-le-Grand and Longueval.

15 September: 41st Division, with tank support, entered Flers. After advance, 20 DLI came through a heavy barrage and occupied the old front trenches astride Longueval-Flers road.

16 September: 20 DLI called forward beyond Flers and had to negotiate heavy German barrage on south side of Flers. 'C' Company established in Box and Cox Trenches on the north side of Flers. Rest of 20 DLI in sunken road leading to Ginchy from which 15 DLI had been withdrawn. 20 DLI consolidated their position during the rest of the day and all next day. Relieved by troops of the 55th Division.

18 September: Montauban was reached early morning. Eight days training near Becordal-Becourt.

27 September: Moved up to the front line east of Mametz via by Montauban.

28 September: Relieved 8th Liverpool Regiment in reserve trenches near Flers.

29 September: Employed as carrying parties to the front which was now beyond Gueudecourt.

30 September: In the afternoon two companies relieved two from 11th West Surrey Regiment in the line. 'D' company suffered from German shelling. In the evening other two companies joined so completing the relief. Night spent in improving the line dug beyond Gird Support Trench.

1 October: At dawn 20 DLI in line north-west of Gueudecourt. Sent out patrols to discover German strengths. Relieved some hours later and withdrew to Pommiers Redoubt at night.

2 October: Under training at Pommiers Redoubt.

7 October: In reserve as British attacked along the whole line from Lesbœufs to Le Sars. 20 DLI moved forward in evening. The maps were inaccurate; trenches were blocked with wounded; and the guides lost their way. All under heavy German fire.

8 October: Trench digging and wiring under fire.

11 October: Relieved and that morning reached Mametz Wood.

13 October: Began to move away from Somme arriving by train at Godewaersvelde on 20 October.

The 22nd Battalion DLI was the Pioneer Battalion of the 8th Division, III Corps. The 8th Division was credited with the following Battle, but was given no credit for the actions from 23 October to 24 November 1916:

Battle of Albert 1-13 July

BATTALION ITINERARY 1916

17 June: By train from Le Havre to Frechencourt in the Somme area.

20 Jun: Moved to Bavelincourt and until 30 June were busy unloading ammunition and repairing roads.

23 June: All available officers visited the line east of Albert for experience of the trenches.

30 Jun: 22 DLI marched to Millencourt. 'A' Company remained there whilst the other companies moved forward to Albert.

1 July: The 8th Division attacked Ovillers and La Boisselle with limited success. 22 DLI was to consolidate the ground won.

2 July: Brought up stores for the Royal Engineers and carried wounded back. 100 men established a dump in captured trenches near La Boisselle.

3 July: 22 DLI was relieved and in the evening left Millencourt for Givenchy east of Bethune.

From 3 July to 12 October: 22 DLI was in the Cambrai Sector.

13 October: The 8th Division, with 22 DLI, entrained for the Somme.

14 October: Arrived at Citadel Camp. 'D' Company ordered to Montauban to work on the roads.

20 October: HQ and 'B' Company moved to Waterlot Farm.

21 October: 'B' and 'D' Companies started work on a communication trench, which was then suspended in view of an attack on Zenith Trench planned for 23 October. Each company was given a different task.

23 October: 'C' Company to Spectrum Trench astride the Gueudecourt to Le Transloy road. Followed second wave of attacking infantry. Started to dig a communication trench from Zenith Trench back to the old front line. Short rest at Waterlot Farm, then digging continued until completed on night of 25 October. 'B' Company ordered to dig a communication trench forward to Zenith Trench, but before the attack, came under intense fire. Later acted as stretcher-bearers and eventually reached Waterlot Farm early on 25 October. Returned later to assist in consolidating Zenith Trench. 'D' Company reached Bulford Trench, behind Rainbow Trench at 7 am 23 October. One platoon to Shine Trench; one to Mild Trench and remaining two improved Bulford Trench. Returned Waterlot Farm but on 26 October assisted 'B' Company to consolidate Zenith Trench. 'A' Company worked in reliefs night and day as stretcher bearers until 25 October. On 26 October started to dig a new communication trench and in the evening were joined by 'C' Company.

26-29 October: 'B' and 'D' Companies continued digging trenches to be relieved by 'A' and 'C' Companies. 'B' Company then worked as stretcher-bearers. 'D' Company continued digging.

30 October: Relieved and gradually withdrew to Montauban.

1 November: Rested at the Citadel, less 'A' Company left behind to clear up the battlefield.

3 November: 'A' Company arrived at the Citadel.

7 November: Marched to La Briqueterie near Montauban. The 8th Division was going into the line before Le Transloy.

8 November: Before Le Transloy. Three companies worked on a new communications trench from Ginchy to the front line, while 'D' Company laid duck-boards up to Flank Trench.

12-28 November: The 8th Division rested but Pioneers worked on corduroy roads from Ginchy to Lesbœufs and Ginchy to Flers. Also made fascines at Caftet Wood, near Carnoy.



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29 November; 22 DLI rejoined the 8th Division at Hornay.
